2019 Youthworks Mission Trip to Portland, Oregon

June 8-14



What are Youthworks Mission Trips?

YouthWorks provides Christ-centered mission trips for more than 20,000 teenagers and adult leaders in over 45 communities across the U.S. and beyond. These mission trip experiences positively impact the communities they partner with and the teenagers who are stretched and challenged through a week of service. One of those communities is in Portland, Oregon, which is where seven youth and two adults from Living Water will travel to this month.

Where will we stay?

We will stay with about 50 other middle-school and high-school youth from all over the country at Resurrection Lutheran Church, which is only 15 minutes from the Portland International Airport.

What will we do?

We will learn about issues that Portlanders face, such as homelessness, gentrification, historic and current racism and concern over environmental issues. We will also partner with local organizations to meet ongoing needs in the community. During the week, our students may serve all or part of the week at Oregon Food Bank, Portland Rescue Mission, Ronald McDonald House Charities, The Children's Book Bank, Metro Portland Parks and Recreation, and an organization called "Because People Matter."

Living Water's 24/7 office fish responds to a query about quilts

Q. I was bowled over when I saw the kaleidoscope of quilts in the sanctuary a few weeks ago. How many quilts were blessed that morning?

A. Eighty-eight quilts were blessed on Sunday, April 28. That's a new high for Piecemakers Mission Quilting, a ministry team established five years ago to make 60" x 80" quilts for Lutheran World Relief. Piecemakers' initial 30 quilts were blessed in 2015, and the number has increased each year. Altogether, this team has made around 300 quilts, enough to cover 10,000 square feet. Woo-hoo!

LWR receives the majority of Piecemakers' quilts. Other recipients have included our graduating high school seniors, a refugee family, and California Lutheran University's outreach to local residents impacted by last November's wildfires and Thousand Oaks mass shooting.

These colorful 100% cotton quilts can make a significant difference for recipients. To quote our website, "First and foremost, recipients use their LWR quilts to shield against the cold and rain, and for warm bedding. But their versatility also makes quilts useful as simple tents, floor coverings, or a wrap to hold a baby on a mother's back."

This year's blessing of quilts – and 120 Personal Care Kits collected for LWR by another ministry team – featured free-will donation envelopes pinned to quilts. This low-key appeal to support LWR's shipping costs netted \$1,140. Of this, \$500 went to LWR. The balance serves as seed money for the next crop of quilts.

Piecemakers' quilt-making involves teamwork to carry out a laundry list of steps: purchasing materials, washing, ironing, cutting, sewing, assembling, tying, and binding. Though some Piecemakers quilters work on quilt squares at home, this 12-member team gathers twice monthly from October through May. Contact Myrna Ulland if you'd like to get involved (washing and ironing are perfect "entry level" tasks). She'll also happily provide Thrivent members with writing guidelines for requesting a Thrivent Action Team Grant for the purchase of batting and fabric.

Join us for a special summer session of our Tuesday Women's Bible Study at Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center. Following our study, we'll have lunch. Mark your calendars now and look for a reminder from Myrna Ulland in early July. We'll need to confirm our lunch reservations by July 16th.



The summer issues of Gather magazine (June and July/August) feature a three-session study on the book of Esther, one of the latest writings of the Old Testament. Esther was perhaps written to inspire Jews who had been scattered in the diaspora. The narrative takes place in the court of the King of Persia, King Ahasuerus. Some think that it was written to explain and establish the Jewish festival of Purim. This three session-study is written by Kay Ward, a retired bishop of the Moravian Church who now lives in Watertown, Wisconsin. Kay was the first woman to be elected a bishop in the 541 years of the Moravian Church. We will use all three sessions when we meet on July 23.

Session one: For such a time as this: Esther the queen—Voices in the king's court

Session one sets the scene for the story of Esther and her adopted father, Mortecai. Esther and Mortecai are Jews living under the rule of the Persian king, King Ahasuerus. When Esther becomes the queen, her faith is tested. The Jews, those who have been carried off from their homeland, struggle with living as strangers in a foreign land. In this session you'll think about how our culture may challenge our faith.

Session two: For such a time as this: Esther saves the Jews—Finding our voices

In session two we learn how, when the Jews are threatened, Esther uses her strong faith and the love of her people to embolden her to act. Through some clever schemes, intelligence and a realistic assessment of her situation, Esther is able to save her people. "For such a time as this" is Mortecai's gentle reminder to Esther that God has placed her in the king's court to use her voice. How might God be reminding us of our need to find our voice as we live out our faith?

Session three: For such a time as this: Remembering Esther: Using our voices

In session three, we'll examine the last chapters of the book of Esther, which are full of hope for the future for the Jews. The defeat of their enemies is to be celebrated in a feast, the festival of Purim. Directions are given for the celebration of the festival. As women of faith, full of love for God and others, we will consider ways to find and use our voices in our present circumstances - "for such a time as this."

Note: Women's Bible Study will only meet on July 23.
Regular weekly sessions will resume in the Fall.

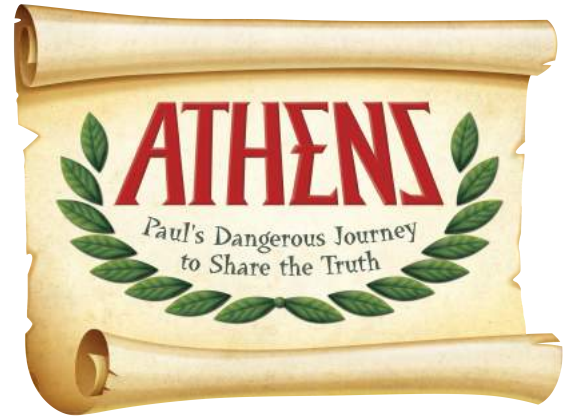

Our annual Diapers and Dollars drive to support the Alleluia Lutheran Diaper Closet concluded on Mother's Day. Once again, through the generosity of this congregation, and with a \$250 Thrivent Action Team grant, we were able to deliver more than 3,000 diapers and more than 7,000 diaper wipes to Alleluia Lutheran on May 14th. In addition, \$800 was received to assist Alleluia Lutheran in purchasing diapers/wipes. This ministry serves an average of 140-150 children with distributions twice a month. Alleluia estimates they need 11,000 diapers each month to support the babies and toddlers served by "A Better Chance" diaper closet. This ministry has revitalized the small congregation of Alleluia Lutheran in Avondale and they appreciate our support! 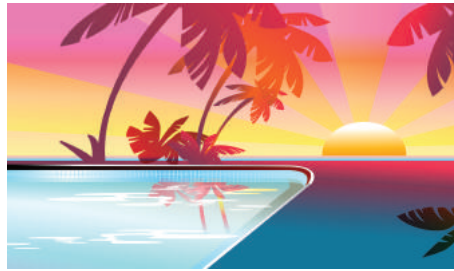
PENTECOST READERS NEEDED

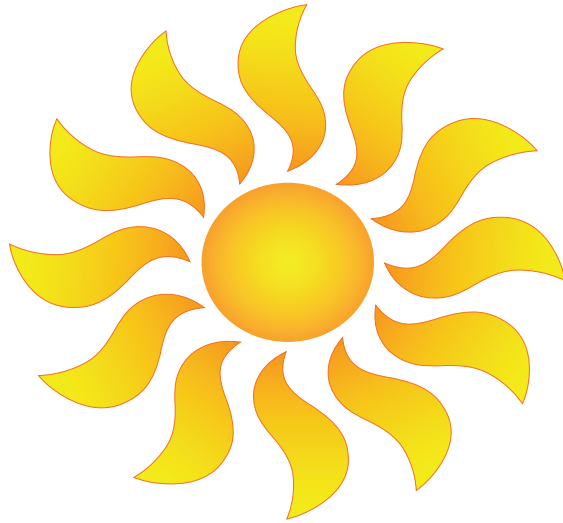

We have received another Thrivent Action Team grant of \$250 to help purchase new books for this drive, which we will do through our connection with First Book.

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY MESSAGE

Here at Living Water Lutheran Church, we are fortunate to have a diverse and talented congregation who greatly contribute their time, talent and financial resources to the many events and causes which we undertake. Although there are many needs and opportunities to serve, it may be hard for one to know how they can actually help or what their "special gift" is. Oftentimes, that special gift is not even discovered until they actually become involved in the act of serving. We sometimes need to remind ourselves that whenever we serve others in any way, we are actually serving God. So, if you're not quite sure if there's a place for you to serve at Living Water, please read the following "Open Letter" to a congregation member from a pastor of another church. It may make the who, what and how of serving more clear.

Open Letter to Jane Ordinary

Dear Jane:

I am writing to help you shake this feeling of uselessness that has overtaken you. Several times you've said that you don't see how Christ can possibly use you. The church must bear part of the responsibility for making you feel as you do. I have in mind the success-story mentality of the church. Our church periodicals tell the story of John J. Moneybags who uses his influential position to witness for Christ. At the church youth banquet, we have a testimony from All-American football star, Ox Kick-offsky, who commands the respect of his teammates when he witnesses for Christ. We are led to think that if you don't have the leverage of stardom or a big position in the business world, you might as well keep your mouth shut. Nobody cares what Christ has done for you.

We've forgotten an elementary fact about Christian witness, something that should encourage you: God has chosen what the world calls foolish to shame the wise. He has chosen what the world calls weak to shame the strong. He has chosen things of little strength and of small repute, yes, and even things which have no real existence to explode the pretensions of the things that are, that no man may boast in the presence of God.

When Jesus Christ chose His disciples, He didn't choose Olympic champs or Roman senators. He chose simple people like you. Some were fishermen, one was a political extremist, another was a publican, a nobody in that society. But these men turned the Roman world upside down for Christ. How did they do it? Through their popularity? They had none. Their position? They had none. Their power was the power of Christ through the Holy Spirit.

Jane, don't forget that we still need the ordinary in the hands of Christ to turn the world upside down.
